GOVERNANCE



In 2024 we achieved new accreditation across the business including:

NATIONAL LITERACY TRUST CAMPAIGN

We funded the National Literacy Trusts Words for Work: Dream Big. which brings together schools and local businesses to support primary aged pupils to develop their oracy skills, raise aspirations and challenge stereotypes.

The programme was delivered to 87 children at a local primary school in Hastings. 7 volunteers from Triangle attended a bespoke engagement session which included 3 different activities:
